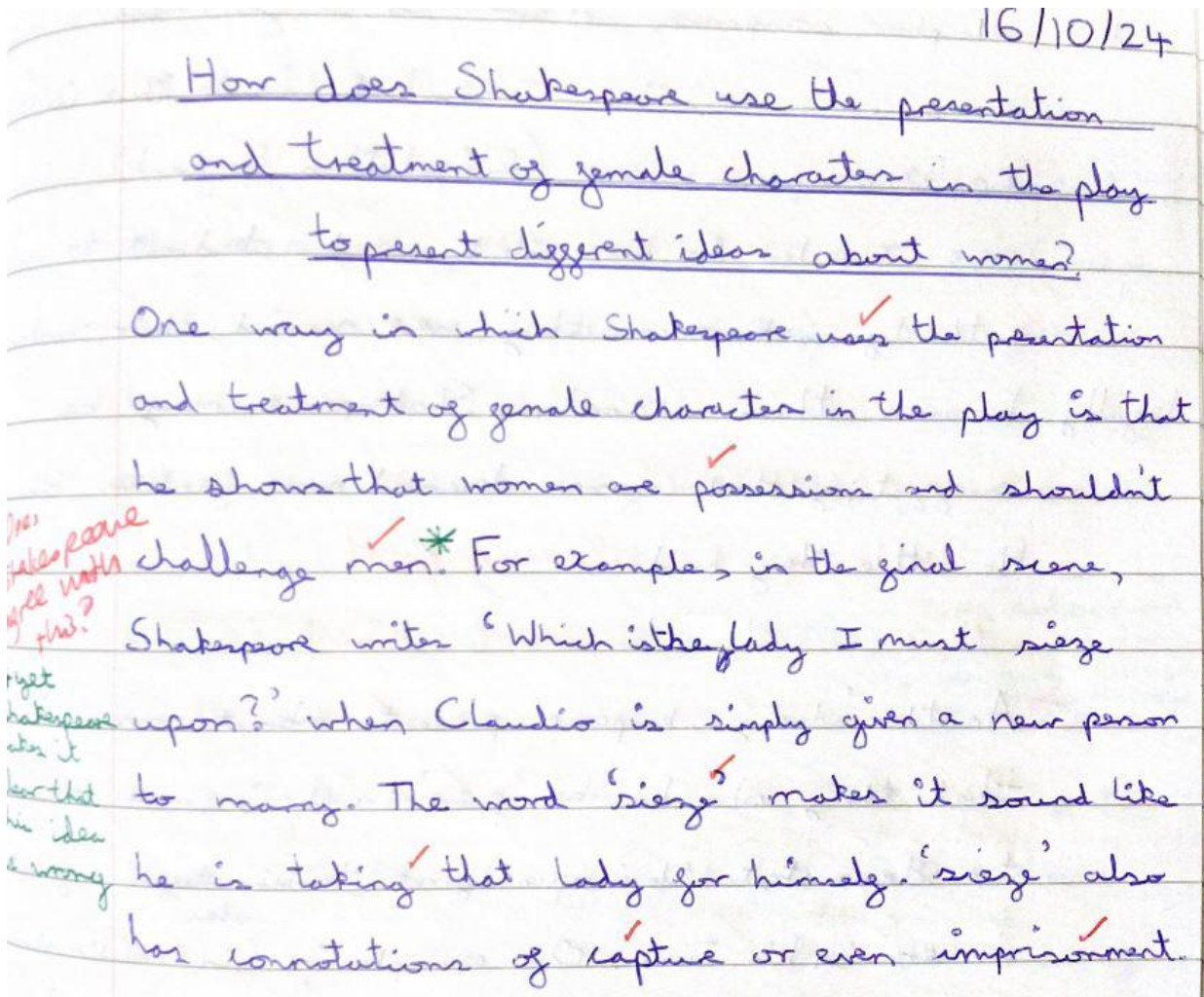


## Example Year 8 Student Work - English

The following gives some examples of the level of work covered in English at Key Stage 3 including details of how we expect students to set out their work and engage with feedback received. Students who follow these steps and respond to the individual feedback they have been given, will make the best progress.

### Classwork



- The pupil has set out the title and date at the top of their work.
- The pupil has responded to the teacher's correction in green ink.
- In this work, which assesses reading skills, the pupil has closely analysed the language which the writer has used.
- The pupil has also quoted accurately from the text which they have studied in class.

## Student response to feedback given by their teacher

Overall, I believe that they are treated like birds stuck in a cage, not much power or right. However, Beatrice is trying to break out of that cage to become equal to men, where neither gender is superior or inferior to another.

✓ you supported all your ideas with references and had ideas about the context (2-7+)

T1 - Make the writer's viewpoint more clear in your writing

T2 - Make close analysis of language and focus on connotations of words.

\* Back in the time when Shakespeare wrote this, the men had full control. Before you were married, your dad controlled you, after marriage, it was your husband.

- The teacher has given the pupil a level for their work, using our Key Stage Three levels.
- The teacher has given the pupil a comment on the strengths of their work as a whole.
- The teacher has given the pupil two targets for their work, based on a set of targets for the class as a whole.
- The pupil has written these targets onto their work.
- The pupil has identified a place in their work where the targets can be applied, and written an additional section that would improve their work.
