It's hard to believe ROAD is Jim Cartwright's debut play. It took the theatrical world by storm when it premiered at the Royal Court in 1986 and has gone on to have several major productions and a seminal television adaptation, cementing it as one of the most significant pieces of modern drama in the last hundred years.

The play explores the lives of the people in a deprived, workingclass area of Lancashire during the government of Margaret Thatcher, a time of high unemployment and strikes in the north of England. Despite its explicit nature, it was considered extremely effective in portraying the desperation of people's lives at this time, as well as containing a great deal of humour. Set on a road on a busy night, the audience delve into the houses on the street and the characters' lives.

It's easy to see some of the parallels with today. The play looks at the forgotten, the marginalised, and often those deemed untouchable (by their government at least). To some contemporary audiences it might feel a little contrived but the truth of the characters, their lives, their often-desperate calls for "hope", can be plainly seen on our television screens every night. All too often their cries fall on deaf ears. Tonight, your host, Scullery, invites you to observe and to listen. To hear their stories.

Whilst the play is set in Lancashire, the nature of working-class culture, poverty and economic downturn has spread (unfortunately) across the UK for much of the last 30 years. What could be considered a forgotten minority is now on everyone's doorsteps, so this production isn't set anywhere in particular. It's just set, as the play demands, on a road. Any road where people have lost their place and been forgotten – not just in terms of their financial needs but, perhaps more importantly, of their place in society too.

Enjoy the show.


